The 50-Year Flood

We woke up on the morning of March 2nd with water rising much faster than was forecast the night before. From the forecast, we thought we had plenty of time to move and stack things higher the next morning and afternoon, if needed. By 6am the next morning, water was already coming into the basement of the white parsonage. There was a quick response to move all of the vehicles to higher ground. The box truck and one of the church vans would not start and became victims to the flood, but fortunately they were insured. The water kept rising all day and did not crest until about 8pm that night. John and Chris stayed in their trailer, and it became an island. When the river finally crested at 39.04', the water was about 1-2" from pouring into their front door. Mike and Connie lost everything in their basement, not to mention some irreplacable photographs. Ed and Margaret, who now live in the white parsonage behind the church, lost everything in their basement, plus their heat pump and a new washer and dryer.



The Gym

The gym and the barn had 5 feet of water in them. Five feet of dry wall, wood, and insulation had to be removed, along with the contents of the buildings. The Abbey trailer and Ed's old trailer were a total loss. Because we live in a flood plain, the flood insurance is sky high. Therefore, only the church van and box truck were covered. Cleanup and Response

Volunteer reponse to this disaster has been fantastic!!! Churches have come from all over to help and more are scheduling trips to assist with cleanup and repair of the damage that has occurred. People and churches we've never had any contact with have sent in donations to help cover the damage. For the families on campus, this turned out to be a spring cleaning on steroids. John's garage, aka the community hardware store and tool depository, was flooded to 5 feet. Lots of tools and hardware were damaged beyond repair, but thanks to much assistance from family and friends, we are seeing great progress in his garage.

Through donations sent to us, we were able to help out with cleaning supplies, water, and food baskets for many people. Supplies were brought to us from as far away as Maryland. Donated clothing and furniture has been given away to the community, and we are expecting more donations in the future. Our clothing closet was destroyed in the flood, and we will not be
