This first paragraph was sent shortly after the flood:

Flood 2022

It started one day as a drizzle. Then the heavy rains and winds hit. July 28th is a day we will all remember. As waters began to break the banks and overflow our neighbors woke us with a desperate need for help. The waters were coming. We rushed out of our beds and began to help evacuate those closest to the river. Within an hour or so we were all wading through water. Our neighbors were carrying their things past our own home and up the hill. I remember stopping my husband and children from helping the neighbors for just a few minutes to bring their attention to the fact that the water had also surrounded our home at this point. It was time to grab a few things from our own home. We hurried as fast as possible to move important things up high hoping the water wouldn't reach the inside of our home. We had gone through this very thing last year. At least that was what we thought. Little did we know what awaited us in the days to come. After we grabbed a few things we got back to helping our neighbors. We eventually had a visit from our local police





dept doing a

home to home evacuation for our area. The water was going to get worse much faster than last year. The water was swift and the currents were stronger than the year before. That's when the fear really hit. Leaving our home with our 4 children, my brother, my uncle, Mamaw, Papaw, and my husband was terrifying. Little did we know it was only going to get worse. After a day or so of hearing the absolute worst we were able to wade through the water only to find out we had lost all our earthly possessions. Everything we had worked to build for our children and ourselves was gone. No way to rebuild. A complete and total loss.

We were left with something.

We were left with fear, uncertainty, brokenness and lots of displaced emotions. What are we to do now? The only thing that came to mind. "Wilma, you have to take it one day at a time." This rang over and over in my heart. I knew God was talking. More like whispering. Everything was silent as I peered into our home.





I could hear God whispering. "One day at a time. Tomorrow is not for you yet. It is for me". I know God is taking care of our tomorrows. The pain is still so real. Nightmares plague us. Those displaced emotions creep up trying to ravage the peace God has given us. We walked through inches of mud with heavy hearts and tears in our eyes. We were finally in our home looking at what was once our safe place, our shelter, our home. The weeks of cleaning began a few short days later. It was unbearable cleaning out our home and throwing everything into piles for pickup.

All this time we had stayed in hotel rooms. Finally a breakthrough. A camper trailer was presented to us from papaws workplace. Which is now where all 10 of us are living. Not an easy thing but God definitely delivered. One day at a time. God new before the flood whats ahead of us. We have learned our home is a total loss. Our contractor gave us the numbers. To rebuild from the ground up we are looking at over \$192,000. It must be torn

down and rebuilt from the ground up. That to us is an impossible number. Another devastating blow. Our hearts ached from the news. Our hope is in God and finding a home that will fit us all. God whispered Tomorrow is for me not you. My heart overflowed with tears. I know my God has us. Pushing aside the news we have pushed on doing the best we can one day at a time. Never before had I been faced with such uncertainty but yet calmness in knowing my God is still working on our tomorrow. We may not know what that looks like. Our children asked "what are we going to do?" I simply smile and tell them we are going to wait on the Lord our God. He has our tomorrow and is taking way better care of us then we ever could on our own. They are still scared of course. They're young and this very situation is growing them for the Lord. God is growing us. So I don't know what tomorrow looks like or where we will be but I can comfort my family in the undeniable truth that God is already taking care of it. We also recently learned that our family of 10 is growing by 1. Our precious blessing will be here in March. God gave us a wonderful little girl. If you don't know us, we are raising 2 of our nephews, 1 of our nieces and our only son who will be 17 this year. He was our miracle. Never did we imagine we would have another for health reasons. God sent us this little girl when he knew we were going to need this blessing. August 8, 2022 was the day we learned we were having another baby. God works in the most amazing ways. Yes it's a scary time and no I don't know where the help will come from or what it will look like but I do know God has it all. God has our tomorrow and he knows where the help will come from and what it will look like. I pray our story reaches those who need to hear it. Maybe it will help someone else. Hold faith for tomorrow belongs to God. One day at a time.
